The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) has scheduled Evidentiary Hearings (EHs) to consider an interim residential rate design settlement proposal that will be effective by summer of 2014. This interim residential rate design settlement proposal was agreed upon by Southern California Edison Company (SCE), the Office of Ratepayer Advocates, The Utility Reform Network, the Coalition of California Utility Employees, the Sierra Club, and the Natural Resources Defense Council. The settlement proposal addresses multiple proposed revenue adjustments anticipated to be implemented by SCE beginning in summer, to align rates with the actual costs of providing electric service to customers and to simplify rate plans.

Assembly Bill (AB) 327 authorized the CPUC to consider changes to California's rate structure and renewable energy policies. As required by CPUC Rulemaking R.12-06-013, SCE filed a proposed request with the CPUC on November 22, 2013, to change residential rates by the summer of 2014. The request was later modified by SCE and subsequently a Settlement was reached by the Parties listed above. However, the CPUC will review the Settlement to determine if it is in the public's interest and will decide whether to accept, modify, or reject it.

ILLUSTRATIVE EFFECT ON ELECTRIC RATES AND BILLS

If approved by the CPUC, the proposed Settlement would take effect in summer of 2014. This proposed Settlement will not change the amount of total revenues collected by SCE, which are determined in other proceedings. The proposed Settlement maintains the four tiered residential rate structure. Additionally, it keeps the Basic Charge at the same level. The Settlement will also maintain the current baseline allowances, which are billed at the Tier 1 rate. The Settlement proposes to increase the Tier 1 rate by 12% and Tier 2 rate 17%. The proposal also increases Tier 3 by approximately 2% and Tier 4 by approximately 5%.

The following table shows the difference between the rates currently charged to our customers, and the proposed rates which would result if the Commission approves the Settlement Agreement:

If the Settlement proposal is adopted, some residential customers may see bill increases and some may see bill decreases, depending upon their monthly usage levels and their rate plan.

Under SCE’s proposed changes, the California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) program discount will remain within the 30-35% range required by AB327 and remain at approximately the current levels for average CARE customers.

HOW DOES THE CPUC'S DECISION-MAKING PROCESS WORK?

The settlement proposal will be reviewed through the CPUC's formal process. The settlement proposal has been assigned to two CPUC Administrative Law Judge (Judges). The Judges preside over the proceeding, which may include evidentiary hearings to give parties an opportunity to present evidence and cross-examine witnesses. Members of the public may attend, but not participate in, these hearings unless they are parties to the case. The hearings and documents submitted in the proceeding become part of the formal record that the Judges rely upon in writing a proposed decision to present to the five-member Commission for its consideration.

Any CPUC Commissioner may issue an alternate decision. The proposed and any alternate decisions are voted upon by the Commissioners at a CPUC meeting. The CPUC may adopt all or part of the settlement proposal, modify it or deny the proposal in its entirety.
