SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON COMPANY NOTICE OF FILING OF APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL OF ITS 2009-2011 ENERGY EFFICIENCY PROGRAM PLANS AND PUBLIC GOODS CHARGE AND PROCUREMENT FUNDING REQUESTS Application 08-07-021

On July 21, 2008, Southern California Edison Company ("SCE") filed an application with the California Public Utilities Commission ("CPUC") asking for increases in SCE's electric revenues. The application, designated as A.08-07-021 by the CPUC, requests that the CPUC authorize an increase of \$559.1 million in electric revenues over the next three years (2009 – 2011). If approved by the CPUC, the electric revenue requirement will increase electric rates by approximately 1.6% in 2009.

ENERGY EFFICIENCY PROGRAM PLANS

In the application, SCE requests CPUC approval of SCE's proposed program plans and budgets, which will allow SCE to continue to effectively and efficiently promote, implement and maintain the Commission's Energy Efficiency Program. These programs are intended to pursue and encourage energy-efficient measures over both the short- and long-term. In order to fully implement these programs in 2009, 2010 and 2011, SCE is requesting Energy Efficiency Program annualized funding of \$186.4 million above the existing 2008 funding amounts, which compared to revenues at present rates, is an increase of approximately 1.6%. The following table shows an estimate of proposed revenue and rate changes by customer group:

If the CPUC approves the Application, the average monthly residential bill of 600 kWh will change from \$82.70 at present rates to \$83.42, an increase of 0.9%.

ACTION THE CPUC MAY TAKE ON SCE'S APPLICATION

Before acting on SCE's application, the CPUC may hold evidentiary hearings. If hearings are held, SCE, the CPUC's independent Division of Ratepayer Advocates ("DRA") and other interested parties may present testimony. Parties may offer proposals that differ from those presented in the application.

After considering all evidence presented, the CPUC will issue a decision on the application. The actual plan adopted by the CPUC may differ from what is requested by SCE in its application.
