APPLICATION FILING IN A.13-04-001**

PROPOSAL TO INCREASE YOUR ELECTRIC RATES

In compliance with California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) decisions, Southern California Edison Company (SCE) has filed an Energy Resource Recovery Account (ERRA) application, which sets forth SCE's procurement-related operations for the Record Period January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012. This application is referred to as A.13-04-001.

In this application, SCE demonstrates that for the Record Period: (1) dispatch of generation resources and related spot market transactions complied with SCE's Assembly Bill (AB) 57 Procurement Plan; (2) procurement expenses eligible to be recovered through the ERRA Balancing Account were accurately recorded; and (3) SCE's contract administration activities and utility-retained generation (URG) operations were reasonable.

In addition to presenting SCE's recorded 2012 costs for review, this application requests approval to recover \$4.998 million (including franchise fees and uncollectibles). During the Record Period, two accounts authorized by the CPUC were under-collected: (1) the Litigation Costs Tracking Account and (2) the Market Redesign and Technology Upgrade Memorandum Account. Also during the Record Period, two accounts authorized by the CPUC were over-collected: (1) the Project Development Division Memorandum Account and (2) the Purchase Agreement Administrative Costs Balancing Account. The requested \$4.998 million represents the remaining costs associated with the under-collected accounts after offset with the over-collected accounts.

Compared to revenues at present rates as of March 1, 2013, this application requests a revenue increase of \$4.998 million, or .042%, beginning in 2014. **If the Commission should approve total rates as requested, an average residential electric customer using 600 kilowatt-hours per month would expect to see an increase of \$0.06 per month, from \$113.25 to \$113.31.** The following table shows current rates compared to an estimate of proposed revenue and rate changes by customer group.

EVIDENTIARY HEARINGS

The CPUC **may** hold evidentiary hearings whereby formal parties of record provide testimony and are subject to cross-examination before a CPUC Administrative Law Judge (ALJ). These hearings are open to the public, but only formal parties of record may participate. The CPUC has its own court reporters who will record the comments of those formal parties of record participating in the evidentiary hearings. After considering all proposals and evidence presented during the formal hearing process, the assigned ALJ will issue a proposed decision. When the CPUC issues a final decision on the application, it may adopt, amend, or modify all or part of the ALJ's proposed decision as written. The CPUC's decision may be different than SCE's request.

CPUC PROCESS

The Division of Ratepayer Advocates (DRA) is an independent arm of the CPUC, created by the Legislature to represent the interests of all utility customers throughout the state to obtain the lowest possible rates for service consistent with reliable and safe service levels. DRA has a multi-disciplinary staff with expertise in economics, finance, accounting, and engineering.
